Lopness Picnic Site.	16:00.
Heinrich Schuur will unveil a new Interpretation Panel by the picnic benches above the stranded wreck of the B-98 torpedo boat-destroyer. The afternoon's low tide should allow a close-up inspection of the remains of the ship – but waterproof knee-length boots are recommended.	
N.B. Lopness Picnic Site is 4.5 miles/7.2 km from the Heritage Centre in Lady Village. Car-parking space at the site is limited, and we are grateful to James and Sara Scobie, who have agreed to allow their field to be used – at car-owners' own risk – as a car-park on 4 June. There will be a clear sign at the open gate to the field, which is 350m before the Lopness Site.	
Lopness Bay.	16:30.
Presence, off shore, of Royal Navy P 2000 Patrol Boats <i>Biter</i> and <i>Blazer</i> .
