

Education, Leisure and Housing Committee: 10 September 2025. ISLANDS COUNCIL Care Inspectorate – Westray Junior High School Nursery.

Report by Director of Education, Communities and Housing.

1. Overview

- 1.1. On 23 April 2025, the Care Inspectorate undertook an unannounced inspection of Westray Junior High Nursery. They considered a range of information, including reviewing documentation, speaking to parents, staff and children, as well as observing practice.
- 1.2. The Care Inspectorate identified significant strengths in the settings' work, including:
 - Children experienced warm, caring and nurturing approaches to support their overall wellbeing.
 - Children had fun and were actively involved in leading their own play and learning experiences.
 - Children accessed an environment that was warm and welcoming.
 - Snack and lunch time was a positive, relaxing and sociable time for children.
 - The staff and leadership team had a clear focus on improving outcomes for children and their families.
 - There were clear procedures in place to manage lone working arrangements, and staff were confident in implementing these.
- 1.3. The following area for improvement was identified:
 - Robust quality assurance processes needed to be developed around safeguarding procedures.
- 1.4. The four key quality indicators from the Care Inspectorate Quality Framework were graded as follows:
 - How good is our play care and learning? Very Good.
 - How good is our setting? Very Good.
 - How good is our leadership? Adequate.

- How good is our staff team? Very Good.
- 1.5. Overall the report was very positive and the setting will continue to develop practice and address any improvements.
