# **Integration Joint Board**

Date of Meeting: 10 February 2021.

Subject: Joint Inspection of Services for Children and Young People in Need of Care and Protection in Orkney.

## 1. Summary

- 1.1. The Care Inspectorate report was published in February 2020. Detailed reports have been submitted to the Integration Joint Board on 29 October and 9 December 2020 noting progress on the actions from the Improvement Plan.
- 1.2. The following summary provides an update of the core areas of the Improvement Plan which have progressed since the previous meeting of the Integration Joint Board in December 2020.

### 2. Purpose

2.1. To advise Members of the progress on the Joint Inspection of Services for Children and Young People in Need of Care and Protection Improvement Plan.

#### 3. Recommendations

The Integration Joint Board is invited to:

- 3.1. Note the core areas of progress and identified service gaps and delays, set out in sections 4 and 5 of this report.
- 3.2. Scrutinise and seek assurance on the position of the Joint Inspection of Services for Children and Young People in Need of Care and Protection Improvement Plan, attached as Appendix 1 to this report.

# 4. Core Areas of Progress

- 4.1. The following progress has been made since the last update report in December 2020:
- Completion of Multi-agency Child Protection Guidelines and Multi-agency Initial Referral Discussion Procedures.
- Delivery of Multi-agency Training Session and Launch of above Guidelines and Procedures on 2 December 2020 (IMP001a and IMP001b).

- Partnership Self-evaluation and Continuous Improvement Approach completed and approved by the Multi-agency Leadership Group (IMP036) and presented to the Chief Officer Group (Public Protection) on 12 January 2021:
  - Series of multi-agency file audits planned for 2021 (IMP000) first audit to take place 23 – 25 February 2021.
- PARIS via Azure and PARIS Mobile tested and working allowing this improvement area to be marked as complete (IMP010).
- The Lead Nurse for Public Protection, Lynsey Harper, started in post on 5 January 2021. This Improvement is now marked as complete (IMP004).
- The Multi-agency Getting It Right Development Group is progressing work related to more effective joined-up working arrangements (IMP014):
  - Getting It Right Guidelines revision is progressing.
  - The Development Group now includes representatives from Police Scotland and the Third Sector.
- The refresh of Orkney Transition Planning Guidelines is nearing completion (IMP042):
  - o A Launch and training session have been arranged for 19 February 2021.
- Significant ongoing work on stabilising the use of PARIS (IMP038):
  - Analysis on staff feedback is complete and the workplan is under development.
- Working group in place to review and improve the Social Work Out of Hours Service (IMP019).
- A meeting took place with the Care Inspectorate and Care Experienced Young People on 4 December 2020 to reflect on improvements and secure their continual engagement (IMP025).
- Session arranged with Elected Members and the Health Board to discuss the Vision and Priorities of young people on 3 February 2021 (IMP031).
- Strengthening governance, accountability and function of Orkney Public Protection Committee (OPPC) (IMP033):
  - Draft 'Terms of Reference' have been agreed by the OPPC with identified follow up actions prior to adoption.
  - A report on the proposed accountability framework has been circulated and was considered by the Chief Officers Group (COG) on 12 January 2021.
- Recruitment for the joint Action for Children post was unsuccessful, however, the post is being re-advertised (supports IMP007 and IMP019).
- Following a recent Foster Care recruitment drive, there were four applications from suitable individuals and couples who progressed through the initial assessment stage. One couple has had to withdraw for personal reasons and the remaining three families are being offered training and a full fostering assessment.

### 5. Identified Service Gaps and Delays

- 5.1. There are gaps in the provision of direct therapeutic support for young people and there is no specialist infant mental health provision to assist in assessing complex parent infant relationship issues in permanence and adoption work.
- 5.2. The break over the festive period has contributed to delays in delivery of the actions in the Improvement Plan.
