1. Legislative Background

The Council's Licensing Team processes applications for licences, permits and registrations in terms of:

- The Gambling Act 2005.
- The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

2. Types of Licences, Permits and Registrations

Types of applications for licences, permits and registrations governed by the Gambling Act 2005 include:

Premises Licences:

- · Adult gaming centres.
- Betting premises.
- Bingo.
- Casinos.
- Licensed family entertainment centres.
- Provisional statements.
- Tracks.
- · Travelling fairs.

2.1.2.

Permits and Temporary and Occasional Use Notices:

- Club gaming and club machine permits.
- Gaming machines on alcohol licensed premises.
- Occasional use notices.
- Prize gaming.
- Small society lotteries.
- Temporary use notices.
- Unlicensed family entertainment centres.

2.2.

Types of applications for licences governed by the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 include:

- extensions of licensing hours;
- occasional licences;
- premises licences;
- personal licences;
- provisional premises licences;
- temporary licences;
- · transfers of licences; and
- variations of licences,

in respect of:

- the sale of alcohol by retail for consumption on or off premises;
- the supply of alcohol in members' clubs.

2.3.

2.3.1.

All applications require consultation with Police Scotland and other appropriate agencies in accordance with the relevant legislation. For licences in terms of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, the consultation period is prescribed as 21 days, apart from applications for:

- Confirmation of provisional premises licences.
- Extended hours of licensed premises.
- Minor variations of premises licences.

2.3.2.

The minimum processing period for a number of applications in terms of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 is accordingly 2 months to allow for administrative work to circulate applications, prepare reports for consideration by the Board (where required) and prepare the relevant licences at the conclusion of the determination period.

3.7.

3.7.1.

The Council's Licensing Team deals with many enquiries regarding requirements for licences, permits and registrations under the relevant legislation. These are dealt with by telephone, email or letter. Not all enquiries result in applications.

3.7.2.

Information regarding average numbers of enquiries received and time taken to process is provided in the following table:

4. Future Developments

4.1.

As a second phase in the development of the Customer Service Platform, licensing applications will be automated to the extent that this is possible in law. However, this system will take some time to develop.

4.2.

In terms of the draft Immigration (Alcohol Licensing and Late Hours Catering) (Scotland) Regulations 2018, currently before the UK Parliament, the Board may be required to reject applications made for either a premises or personal licence by individuals not entitled to work in the UK. In terms of the proposed legislation an information sharing system will require to be established between the Board and the Home Office. This would enable the Home Office to object to licence applications being granted if it is "satisfied that granting the licence would be prejudicial to the prevention of illegal working in licensed premises." The proposed legislation will impose an additional pressure on the Licensing Service who will require to notify applications to the Secretary of State and arrange for the consideration of any representations received.
